






The Heart Of The Lowcountry

Founded in 1670 and settled as a colonial seaport, Charleston prospered from agriculture cultivation and its strategic location. Confederate soldiers fired the first shots of the American Civil War on Fort Sumter in 1861, and the city would be devastated by the war. The city slowly repaired damaged buildings and preserved historic architecture. Charleston's economy shifted with the construction of the Navy Yard in 1904 and the emergence of industrial and port activities. Today, the region benefits from a diverse range of industries and a thriving tourism industry.

The Port of Charleston is the most productive port in North America. Manufacturers continue to locate facilities in South Carolina in consideration of numerous business incentives and competitive tax rates. The port is thriving and remains integral for commerce in key industries including automotive manufacturing, consumer goods distribution, refrigerated/frozen exports, transloading resin and grain, and tire manufacturing which will continue to drive traffic through the port.



Economic Strides Moving the Needle

The greater Charleston region benefits from a fast-growing, well-educated population and diverse economy. Much of the Lowcountry's economy revolves around manufacturing, transportation, logistics and other port-related business. The Port of Charleston, owned and operated by the South Carolina State Ports Authority (SCSPA), is one of the ten busiest U.S. ports and handles over \$60 billion in goods each year.

Fast-growing business sectors such as automotive manufacturing, consumer goods distribution, refrigerated imports & exports, and transloading base commodities are contributing to increased port traffic. Steady container traffic at the port has marked historic highs in 2018 and the state of South Carolina is investing heavily in the supply chain of tomorrow by enhancing port-related infrastructure.

Other key industries for the Charleston region include Creative, Healthcare, Higher Education, Military, Power Systems, and Tourism. Technology companies like Blackbaud, which employs 1,400 workers at its Daniel Island headquarters, have also increased their presence in recent years.



Excelling As A Regional Destination

Charleston's growing population, tourism scene, and numerous accolades are attracting infrastructure investments to support future growth. Development activity has accelerated in recent years and is poised to reshape the retail, office, and industrial markets with Charleston's economy continuing to be one of the most attractive in the country.

The retail market is benefitting from the number of visitors and residents arriving in the Lowcountry. North Charleston has the largest volume of retail sales in the state, while specialty and souvenir retailers thrive in popular areas such as King Street and Daniel Island. Along with national trends, food halls and coworking concepts are also opening locations in Charleston. These concepts cater to the gig economy, driving foot traffic and offering superior amenities for businesses.



With sustained growth in recent years, Charleston is home to the busiest airport in South Carolina. The number of passengers traveling through the airport is anticipated to exceed 4 million in 2018. Charleston International Airport recently launched nonstop international flights to London for business and tourism travel. The airport continues to be a major contributor to the regional economy.

8 Airlines currently service Charleston International Airport with nonstop flights to 31 airports and 26 cities in the United States and United Kingdom.

Charleston International Airport creates more than \$200 million in income by supporting 1,915 jobs in Berkeley, Charleston and Dorchester counties.

Visitors spend an estimated \$450 million directly in the Charleston region, helping support over 6,000 jobs and nearly \$200 million in income.
